

In 2009, Dr. David C. and Karina Rilling presented The College of Wooster Art Museum with a gift of forty objects from sub-Saharan Africa and Papua New Guinea. Included in the gift, all of which will be on display in this exhibition, are twenty-one cooking and ritual vessels from the Nuba, Cha'ba, and Bura'eo tribes of Nigeria, the Dogon tribes of Mali, and the Baule'eo tribes of Côte d'Ivoire; a Baga wood drum from Guinea; two Dogon wood ladders; a oruba egungun asuerade from Nigeria; nine *bwami* hats from the Lega tribes of the Democratic Republic of the Congo; and five *sa'os* food bowls from the Sepik River region, Papua New Guinea.
